<p>Proposal three, city proposition one</p>
<p>Shall there be approved and adopted in the City of North Tonawanda, New York, Resolution No. 1 of the Charter Review Committee, which would amend the North Tonawanda City Charter by: (i) reverting the City budget submission deadlines to the previous schedule, which calls for the budget to be submitted by the Mayor to the Common Council by August 1 of every year and adopted by September 15; (ii) eliminating the elected position of City Attorney in favor of a mayor-appointed City Attorney; (iii) separating the elected position of City Clerk-Treasurer into two roles with an elected City Clerk and a mayor-appointed City Treasurer; (iv) mandating that vacancies in elected office be filled by special election where the vacating officer had six months or more remaining in their term; or, where such vacating officer had fewer than six months remaining in their term, elected offices remaining vacant until the next general election; and (v) making various non-substantive updates to the spelling, grammar, and wording throughout the Charter to remove ambiguity?</p> <p style="text-align: center;"> <b>Yes</b>    <b>No</b>  <input type="radio"/>    <input type="radio"/> </p>
